Project Pamoja is a partnership between CAPCO, Musoni Kenya, and Bankers without Borders. ‘Pamoja’ is Swahili word meaning ‘together’. Musoni Kenya is a nationwide microfinance institution (MFI) based in Kenya. Musoni has 14 locations and works with more than 16,000 borrowers, targeting under-banked microentrepreneurs. Musoni has broken away from time-consuming manual processes and instead provides a fully automated, mobile phone-based banking service.

Bankers without Borders assembled a team of six CAPCO employees across Washington, New York, Edinburgh, and Bangalore, to work with Musoni Kenya to help build a robust data analysis tool for easy risk and audit reporting. The volunteers also provided training documentation for staff and a recommendation for a technology solution going forward. The team was tasked to ensure that the tools had a friendly user interface and the capability to quickly process large sets of data.

Prior to starting their volunteer assignment, Gabi Wolozin, Francis Minien, Grace Hollis, Zach Garman, Kamay Li, Mohit Chandiramani spent a few weeks getting to know the organization and understanding the existing data and risk challenges they faced. Their work produced the following deliverables:

- A “future state” recommendation to enable better predictability of fraud and defaults, in order to protect existing loans and expand the bank’s reach
- Excel-based tools to automate analysis of key metrics across Musoni’s loan portfolio
- Excel-based tools to track individual loan payments to monitor risk and identify trends in loan distribution
